The project is still be worked out so as soon as more information is available, I will let all clubs know. Hopefully all Metro District clubs will be willing to participate either in a joint effort or as individual clubs.

CLUB HAPPENINGS

Hilo Y's Men and Women's Club

The Hilo Y's Men & Women's Club was able to financially support its Island of Hawaii YMCA in two ways in recent months. In January of 2020, the club donated \$5,000 during the YMCA's Annual Support Campaign; as a result of the club's annual Christmas Tree sale in the fall of 2019. This was a significant portion of the Annual Support Campaign, as the YMCA gains increasing financial strength after many, many lean years.

More recently, the club applied for a grant from YMI's Special Covid-19 Emergency Response Fund. This was to support First Responders in our local communities. YMI awarded \$2,000 to the club for the YMCA project. This was matched with Hawaii Region contributing \$500, the club adding \$1,000, and \$500 from other donations. The money was used to support the YMCA's First Responder Child Care - YMCA Extended Day Camp. This program can take care of up to 80 kids of first responders with day care, supplementary educational activities, meals, physical activities, crafts, and other activities. Several iPads were purchased to assist with matching educational activities with school assignments and supplementary learning. Comments were received about the value of this program. One family had both parents being first responders, in health services and firefighting, so the need was quite high. In another case a single mother was a visiting nurse, with no nearby family to support child care. Thank you to YMI and Hawaii Region!!!

The club was happy to make a difference on Hawaii Island. It is able to keep functioning through the use of online technology. The GoToMeeting software, similar to Zoom, is used for biweekly club meetings. Business is getting done, but the usual yummy refreshments are sadly missed.

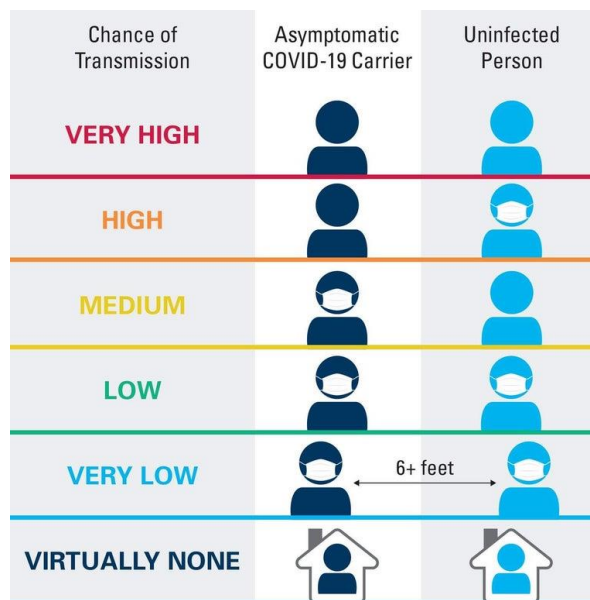
