## Club Activities

The **Bendigo Golden City Bulletin** reports their major donation so far this year (A\$10,000) has been to BlazeAid which uses volunteers to build fences that farmers have lost in fires or floods. BlazeAid uses volunteers between the ages of 12 and 85 and they come from all over Australia as well as many other countries....The **Helena Capital Y-ze News** reports that the Helena YMCA has launched a distance-learning program. It provides remote learning for children through each phase of Helena's back to school plan. Right now, ten weeks are being offered and, as the year goes on, weeks will be added as needed.

## October Focus: Alexander Scholarship Fund/Brad Ishida Dollars for Scholars

The purpose of ASF, which is administered by the Areas, is to promote the training of those seeking to become YMCA staff members. Its aim is to alleviate the desperate shortage of YMCA professionals by: (a) Encouraging young people in the various countries to take on this responsibility and (b) Making financial contributions towards their training. Brad Ishida Dollars for Scholars is administered by the Hawaii Region and provides financial assistance to current YMCA employees or YMI members who wish to increase their knowledge of YMCA programs.
